The internet has transformed publishing, even for academic authors. While the traditional formats of peer-reviewed journals and academic presses continue, the opportunities for authors to reach a wider audience through online publishing offers new venues to publish. In this talk, I will present my experience as editor of *The Art Bulletin* including trends I see in the scholarship and challenges for art history publishing overall.
